COURSES

Esperanto 101: Learning and Using the International Language

Hoss Firooznia, Department of **Mathematics**

Knowing Esperanto, one of the largest growing international languages in the world, is a rich and valuable resource for international travelers. With an estimated two million speakers in over 100 nations, the language, which is both richly expressive and extremely easy to learn, has developed a thriving literature and culture. Additionally, the tight-knit Esperanto community promotes international understanding through services like the Pasporta Servo, a worldwide hostelling service that provides free temporary lodging to Esperantospeaking travelers.

This course will provide training in standard spoken and written Esperanto for students new to the language. Lessons will focus on pronunciation, structure, and basic vocabulary, with an emphasis on the development of communication skills: speaking, comprehension, reading, and writing. We will also discuss how Esperanto is used for international communication, education, and travel.

Optics in the Information Age, OPT 101 Wayne Knox, Professor, Director of The Institute of Optics

Forget glasses. This course begins with a discussion of the properties of Light: refraction, imaging, diffraction, interference, the historical development of optical instruments (the microscope, telescope, laser) then moves into topics not limited to the Internet, high-speed information access, information storage and display, as well as new medical instruments, therapies and applications. Several demonstrations and conceptual model are presented.


Inside the College Admission Process University of Rochester Admissions Office

Refunds for Non-Credit Classes

In order to be granted a tuition refund for non-credit classes, students must cancel their registration in writing and submit it to the University of Rochester's Office of Special Programs (OSP) by 5 pm on the refund deadline; the registration fee (\$45), materials, and event fees are nonrefundable. Faxes (585-461-5901) and emails (osp@rochester.edu) are accepted.

Refund Deadlines

- For all weekly courses: the day before the first class meets. There are no refunds after the class begins. Tuition may be applied towards other available courses.
- For one-day classes and workshops: two days before the class meets.
- Registration, materials, and special event fees are non-refundable.

Please allow 2 – 3 weeks to process refunds. After the deadline, no refunds will

be given unless the class is cancelled. OSP reserves the right to cancel courses in the event of under enrollment or unforeseen circumstances. In the event that OSP cancels a course, a full refund will be granted.

Refunds for Credit Classes

Tuition refunds are not given for audited courses once classes have started. Students wishing to withdraw from a credit course must submit a Drop/Add form to the Registrars Office. Tuition is adjusted according to the schedule below:

- Until 09/09/2005: 100%
- 09/10/05 09/16/05: 90%
- 09/17/05 09/23/05: 50%
- 09/24/05 10/21/05: 25%
- After 10/22/05: no refund

Tuition and Payment

Tuition is indicated with each course description. All fees must be paid in full at the time of registration, either by cash (walk-ins only), credit card, or personal check. There is a \$25 service fee on all returned checks.

Only one discount per class. Discounts do not apply to a course with tuition less than \$100.
